Presentation on the Life and Work of Levi Strauss

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On Tuesday, May 9 in the Roosevelt Middle School Auditorium at Geary and Arguello, former Levi Strauss & Co. archivist will give a presentation titled, "LEVI STRAUSS: The Man Who Gave Blue Jeans to the World."

While the name "Levi Strauss" is synonymous with San Francisco, myths surrounding his life and the invention of jeans have obscured the truth about Strauss's life and business. Lynn Downey, the former historian and archivist for the Levi Strauss & Co., will talk about how Strauss arrived in Gold Rush San Francisco, set up a wholesale business, and eventually patented the invention of riveted denim pants. Strauss helped create modern San Francisco through business and philanthropy.

Lynn Downy has written *Levi Strauss: The Man Who Gave Blue Jeans to the World*, the definitive book about this influential San Franciscan. Books will be available for sale and signing.
